
The Andamans are a part of India with a unique topography. To visit, no visa or passport is required. However, the Andamans can be expensive as all goods have to be brought in by ship from Kolkota or Chennai. The islands are powered by diesel generators, and flights to the Andamans are restricted to a limited number of days in a month!

This was a tool used to crush the independence movement in India. Freedom fighters from across the country were imprisoned here in horrible conditions. We learn about their lives and how the British system of colonization really

worked.

The adventure modules continue today after breakfast, where the batches are rotated to complete all the 3 modules. After the activities, we spend the late evening at leisure along the coast and hit the bed early for a good night's rest after a tiring day.


After lunch, we take the ferry back to Port Blair and spend the time leisurely around the hotel campus.



AN ENTHRALLING DAY EXPLORING ECOLOGY

After breakfast, we explore the colonial ruins at Ross Island. This Island was the capital of the British in the Andamans. It housed soldiers as well as civilians, & the British administered the Andamans from here, using Indian slave labor to build the facilities. We spend the time exploring the navy base and monuments and also interacting with wildlife (deer). After lunch, time for an ancient ecology lesson at the Anthropological museum. It has an archive of tribal life in the Andamans. The early migrators out of Africa settled on the islands and lived there for thousands of years until discovered by the outside

world.
